

HEROLD HUNT FELLOWSHIPS

2005 – 2006

For HGSE doctoral students in APSP who have completed all course work by June 2005 and who intend to pursue careers in elementary or secondary school administration.

Herold Hunt was the first Chairman of the Administrative Careers Program, which was a precursor to programs in Administration, Planning and Social Policy. In his work in Kansas City and Chicago schools, and as Undersecretary of Health, Education and Welfare in Washington, he exhibited that combination of skillful practice and thoughtful reflection, which marks the highest quality of administrative leadership. He believed that administrative training took place in the field as well as the classroom.

With the generous assistance of our alumni, a fellowship fund has been established in Herold Hunt's memory. Fellowships are awarded to doctoral students in APSP who seek to strengthen the relationship between educational theory and practice. It is hoped these fellowships will enable students to pursue problems of practice which would otherwise be overlooked for want of funding. Projects which promise to be useful to others in the field of educational administration will be viewed as particularly worthy.

In making the awards, the committee will consider the merit of the project, its contribution to the practice of elementary or secondary school administration, and the student's academic achievement while at Harvard. Financial need is a factor in the decision.

ELIGIBILITY HGSE doctoral students in APSP who have completed course work by June 2005 are eligible to apply. Applicants must propose projects which deal with elementary or secondary schooling. Preference is given to proposed projects which will lead to the completion of a qualifying paper, analytic paper or thesis.

AWARD Awards vary. In recent years, amounts have ranged between \$2,000 and \$8,000.

- ___ Application form
- ___ Written project proposal, not to exceed 500 words
- ___ Harvard transcripts
- ___ Letters of recommendation establishing the applicant's performance and potential, one in academics, one in the profession. (A single letter which speaks to both academic and professional performance is acceptable.)
- ___ Financial aid form (or international student financial aid form) on file with the Financial Aid office, to establish need
